

FMF Campus Program Support & Resources

FMF provides support to feminist activists through a wide variety of resources, including:

- **Alumni Network:** An activist, social, and career network for graduates to continue their involvement in and connection with the feminist and pro-choice movements as they move out into the nation and the world. FMF alumni in our network receive discount memberships to join the Ms. Community, attend FMF conferences and events, and serve as mentors to feminist campus members in their community.
- **Campus Organizers:** A full-time staff of experienced feminist activists, all recent college graduates, who are available to provide students with support, information, ideas, and opportunities to connect with other FMLAs and affiliate groups.
- **Choices E-zine:** A bimonthly e-newsletter for FMF members that provides updates on the activism of FMLAs and affiliates with stories written by student leaders, national and global feminist news, action alerts, and more!
- **Feminist Faculty and Staff Network:** A nationwide network of feminist faculty and professional staff committed to supporting campus activism for women's rights. This network provides a source of collective action, knowledge, and support for feminist communities on college campuses. Faculty and staff have access to student and community support for Women's Studies programs and women's centers, a directory of participating faculty and staff, networking opportunities through FMF events and conferences, and much more.
- **FeministCampus.org, Feminist.org, Ms. Magazine.com:** These FM websites offer multiple resources on cutting-edge feminist issues, organizing tools, a multi-lingual global resource section, a career center for jobs and internships, a database of campus action ideas, a sign up for action alerts, feminist news, and more!
- **FMLA Fundraisers:** Leadership Alliances have the opportunity to raise funds for their campus group through FMF t-shirt sales, FMF Walks for Women's Lives, and Ms. magazine sales.
- **Monthly Mailings and Tabling Materials:** Monthly mailings provide timely fact sheets, action ideas, videos, stickers, and other resources on cutting-edge feminist and pro-choice issues. - **National Conferences and Regional Feminist Leadership Institutes:** National conferences hosted by FMF bring together feminist student activists from around the country to participate in workshops and assembling with prominent women's rights leaders to develop leadership skills and knowledge about women's and social justice issues both nationally and globally. Regional Feminist Leadership Institutes bring together FMLAs and affiliate groups from several states to network, learn about feminist issues, and hone organizing skills.
- **Networking Opportunities-** FMF encourages and facilitates members of FMLAs, affiliates, alumni, and faculty to connect across the country.
- **On-Campus Skills Building Workshops, Trainings, and Support:** FMF's Campus Organizers travel to campuses to conduct throughout the year to help groups launch, to conduct trainings and workshops on a variety of issues including effective ways to build leadership and activist skills, work with press and media, public speaking, fundraising, event planning, and recruitment and retention of members.
